#### Legislative Oversight Program:

We partner with YMCA Youth and Government programs across the nation. Each year, law students at Wayne Law and the Levin Center staff develop an oversight scenario. At state conferences, we meet with the oversight students to assist them in developing their oversight plan, give them access to the scenario material and help them develop questions for the upcoming hearings. We then hold two hearings where students call a panel of witnesses and question them to uncover the facts surrounding the scenario. At the end of the exercise the students use the information they have discovered to develop resolutions and/or recommendations.

# Levin Center Announces 2022 Oversight Scenario In Partnership with YMCA Youth and Government

25-year-old Morgan Smith spent 6 years behind bars. He sought mental health assistance and regularly received care during his incarceration. Once paroled, Smith was approved for Medicaid, but never became active in coverage. As a result, he was unable to secure a new prescription for medication. Smith was recently arrested for illegal possession of anti-anxiety agents and stimulant prescription drugs, and is facing new felony charges and a possible return to prison.

"To release someone from prison and to place all of these barriers between them and something as essential as health insurance is a profound government failure." says a statewide advocacy group's spokesperson. "I hope to be part of the discussion on how to better ensure those on parole have access to their basic needs."
