



Constitutional Basis of Legislative Investigations

"A legislative body cannot legislate wisely or effectively in the absence of information." --McGrain v. Daugherty (1927)

"It is the proper duty of a representative body to look diligently into every affair of government It is meant to be the eyes and the voice, and to embody the wisdom and will of its --Trump v. Mazars (2020)

Investigations help produce informed decisions on:

--Legislation

-- Program operation

--Spending

--Procurements

Course of an Investigation

- Fact-Finding
- Written Product

- Hearing
- Followup



Investigative Partners

- Committee and Personal Staff
- State Auditor
- State Agencies
- Outside Groups



Oversight Decision Points

- Initiate oversight inquiry
 - Frame investigative topic as fact question
 - Set goals exposure; analysis; solutions; other?
 - Set timeframe for inquiry
 - Form investigative team
 - Invite different views
 - Decide on media plan
- Oversee inquiry
 - Periodic briefings
 - Establish a deadline
- Disseminate results
 - Make factual findings & recommendations
 - Write them up
 - Hearing?
- Followup do something about the problem



Your Super Powers





- Legislator phone calls and emails are returned.
- Legislator questions trigger research, reflection, reconsideration, change.
- Oversight can have as much impact as legislation.

NC Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations

- 48 members, both chambers, both parties, leadership included
 - Substantial oversight jurisdiction, staff, resources
 - Authority to obtain information from state agencies
 - Work with subcommittees, rather than body of the whole
 - Can work with analytical offices and State
 Auditor



Recommendations

- Annual, bipartisan priority-setting process
 - Questions, report, hearing, agreed-on plan, follow up?
- Automatic reporting mechanisms
- Coordinate with analytic bureaucracies
 - Oversight priorities, broader vision, more proactive
 - Assign designated commission members to specific oversight priorities
- Bipartisan process for hearing design
- Oversight of state-issued contracts
- Committee video, transcripts saved online
- Best practices across the US in states of all sizes. When in doubt, ask us!




